



Visit Greater New Haven, and you'll find a place of intriguing contradictions. Home to one of the nation's oldest cities, the region is bursting with innovation. Here urban streetscapes meet coastal beaches, and famous attractions stand beside hidden gems. The world class Yale University Art Gallery and Yale Center for British Art are a must-see for art lovers, but New Haven also boasts its own vibrant community of working artists, who exhibit at several city and regional galleries. The Elm City is also home to numerous theatres, dance troupes, symphony orchestras, concert venues, and public art displays.


New Haven's entrepreneurial spirit nurtures restaurateurs cooking up world cuisine, from French delicacies at the Union League Café to Central and South Indian street food at Sherkaan and all-American hamburger sandwiches at historic Louis' Lunch. But its specialty is "apizza," pronounced "ahbeets," the culinary contribution of the city's Italian immigrants. The famous Sally's and Pepe's pizza parlors vie with several other top contenders for the title Best Pizza Ever. Throughout the region, you'll

also find a cornucopia of coffee shops, ice cream parlors, breweries, wineries, and farm markets to please your palate.

In Greater New Haven, you can spend a day at the beach, explore the Thimble Islands by boat, or hike popular Sleeping Giant State Park. If shopping is your motivation to walk, browse the city's Chapel Street boutiques or The Shops at Yale, or take a trip to the Connecticut Post Mall or Clinton Premium Outlets. Step out to listen to live music or dance the night away at one of New Haven's popular bars and clubs. There's always something to do!


This land was first home to the Quinnipiac peoples, whose story is told through artifacts at the Dawnland Collection of Native American Artifacts at the Dudley Farm Museum. New Haven began as a planned city of nine blocks, which are still part of its footprint today, including the iconic New Haven Green with its three picturesque churches and central fountain. The city's rich and turbulent history is documented in exhibits at the New Haven Museum.

Creativity Thrives in Greater New Haven

Visual art, theatre, music, and dance intersect to create a lively arts scene in Greater New Haven. Here, you can experience Yale University Art Gallery's collection, which stretches from antiquities to modern and contemporary works by Pablo Picasso, Georges Braque, and Wassily Kandinsky, to name a few. The Yale Center for British Art holds the largest collection of British art outside the United Kingdom, including works by J.M.W. Turner, Thomas Gainsborough, and John Constable. Encounter accomplished local artists at Kehler Liddell Gallery, City Gallery, and other local venues. Artspace, NXTHVN, and the Ely Center of Contemporary Art show cutting-edge work in ongoing special exhibitions.

Long Wharf Theatre, Yale Repertory
Theatre, and the Shubert Theatre in New Haven

and the brand new **Legacy Theatre** in Stony Creek as well as several experimental venues bring works to the stage year-round. For live music, catch a classical concert from the **New Haven Symphony Orchestra** or rock out at the brand new **Westville Music Bowl** or **College Street Music Hall**.

New Haven is also home to several blockbuster festivals, including the **International Festival of Arts & Ideas**, now in its 27th year, which brings international acts and local favorites to stages citywide each June. In July, the **Guilford Art Center** hosts Craft Expo, offering handmade crafts by 180 nationally recognized American artists. And every October, Artspace's **Open Source Festival** (formerly Citywide Open Studios) invites the public into artists' studios for a closer look at their work.

Guilford Art Center, 411 Church St., Guilford. Non-profit school, shop, and gallery. Classes and workshops in blacksmithing, ceramics, fiber arts, glass, metalsmithing, painting, photography, stone carving, weaving and more for adults and children. Gallery presents juried and invitational exhibits. Shop carries fine American craft by American artists. Tuition charged per class; entry to gallery and shop is free. 203-453-5947, guilfordartcenter.org

Spectrum Art Gallery and Store, 61 Main St., Centerbrook. This nonprofit gallery was voted "Best Gallery on the Shoreline" in a public poll in 2019. It organizes 6 exhibitions per year including two annual art festivals, Father's Day weekend in Essex, CT and Columbus Day weekend in Madison, CT. Spectrum is a go-to spot for fine crafts including accessories, glass, wood, pottery and jewelry. The gallery offers classes and workshops led by artists showing at the gallery. Morris Steinert Collection of Musical Instruments at Yale, 15 Hillhouse Ave., New Haven. The Collection is home to hundreds of musical instruments from antiquity to the present. We offer three galleries, an audio tour, and an annual series of concerts. 203-432-0822, music.yale. edu/collection

Yale Center for British Art, 1080 Chapel St., New Haven. YCBA houses the largest collection of British art outside the United Kingdom, encompassing works in a range of media from the Elizabethan period to the present day. Free and open to the public. Yale Peabody Museum of Natural

History



A Haven for History Buffs


Make New Haven Museum your first stop for a history of the region and its people, from the Quinnipiac tribe to the first English settlers to immigrants from around the world. Permanent exhibits include "From Clocks to Lollipops: Made in New Haven," treasures from the decorative arts collection, and artifacts of the Amistad Uprising and the famous trial that began here and ended in the Supreme Court. Genealogy buffs will find the museum's Whitney Library an invaluable resource.

For a closer look at the city's African-American history, take Walk New Haven's Lower Dixwell self-guided walking tour, or create your own route through this walkable city. Explore the Grove Street Cemetery—final resting place of luminaries like Noah Webster and Eli Whitney—and the New Haven Green with its three iconic churches, including Center Church, whose crypt contains remnants of the city's original burial ground. Yale University offers guided tours of its campus, located here since 1716.

Greater New Haven's architecture runs the gamut from extant colonial buildings to 20th-century gems designed by Louis Kahn, Paul Rudolph, and Eero Saarinen. Historic structures throughout the region include the Pardee-Morris House (New Haven), Harrison House (Branford), Reynolds-Beers House (North Branford), The Dudley Farm Museum (Guilford), Allis-aushnell House and Museum (Madison), Andrews Homestead (Meriden), Jonathan Dickerman House (Hamden), Thomas Griswold House (Guilford), Thomas Darling House (Woodbridge), and the oldest house in Connecticut, Guilford's Henry Whitfield State Museum.



HISTORY SITES AND MUSEUMS

Amistad Memorial, 165 Church St., New Haven. This monument of Senghe Pieh (known as Joseph Cinque) stands on the former site of the New Haven Jail, where illegally kidnapped Africans were imprisoned in 1839 while awaiting trial. The work distinguished by its unique three-sided form, each side highlighting the capture, trial and return home of Senghe Pieh and his fellow captives. 203-946-8200, amistadcommitteeinc.org/amistad-memorial

Beinecke Rare Book & Manuscript Library, 121 Wall St., New Haven. The Beinecke Library contains the principal rare books and manuscripts of Yale University. The exhibition gallery of this marble, granite, bronze, and glass building showcases rotaXting exhibits. Free. 203-432-2977, beinecke.library.yale.edu

Connecticut River Museum, 67 Main St., Essex. The museum tells the story of the Connecticut River and its people through manuscripts, books, art, and artifacts. It also delivers high-quality exhibitions and educational programming to visitors and residents. 860-767-8269, ctrivermuseum.org

Eli Whitney Museum, 915 Whitney Ave., Hamden. Children's hands-on learning workshop located on Eli Whitney's armory site. 203-777-1833, eliwhitney.org

Grove Street Cemetery, 227 Grove St., New Haven. A National Historic Landmark, the cemetery was established in 1796. Eminent people buried there include Noah Webster, Gen. David Humphreys, Roger Sherman, Charles Goodyear, Walter Camp and Bart Giamatti. 203-787-1443, grovestreetcemetery.org

Henry Whitfield State Museum (c.1639), 248 Old Whitfield St., Guilford. Oldest house in Connecticut, this unusual stone building was constructed in 1639 for Henry Whitfield. The Whitfield House features 17th-19th century furnishings and artifacts. A stroll around the landscaped grounds features extensive stone walls, a bronze statue representing Henry Whitfield, and a ship's cannon from the War of 1812. 203-453-2457, ctvisit.com/listings/henry-whitfield-state-museum

New Haven Green, Bordered by College, Chapel, Church and Elm Sts., New Haven. A National Historic Landmark, the Green is one of the nine squares in America's first planned city. The Green provides a backdrop for three historic churches that are outstanding examples of Gothic, Federal and Georgian design.

New Haven Museum, 114 Whitney Ave., New Haven. Permanent exhibitions include the New Haven Gallery with the Eli Whitney Cotton Gin; The Amistad Gallery with Nathaniel Joselyn's Cinque Portrait; The Ingersoll Room, The Maritime Gallery with additional


Pardee-Morris House, 325 Lighthouse Rd., New Haven. One of New Haven's oldest structures, the property descended in one family through seven generations. The original 1671 house was burned during the 1779 invasion and reconstructed in 1780. Admission is free, 203-562-4183, newhavenmuseum.org

Shore Line Trolley Museum, 17 River St., East Haven. A National Historic District – Enjoy a ride on a restored trolley from the oldest continuously running suburban trolley line in the USA. Summer and select holidays, 203-467-6927, shorelinetrolley.org

Thomas Griswold House (1774)/Guilford Keeping Society, 171 Boston St., Guilford. A 1764 saltbox house with a barn, black-

smith shop, two small corn cribs and a three hole privy. (Seasonal) 203-453-2263, guilfordkeepingsociety.com

William Lanson Statue, Lock St. & Canal St., New Haven, The statue commemorates the life of William Lanson, a 19th century Black entrepreneur from New Haven. His accomplishments include expanding Long Wharf to increase shipping capacity and building the Farmington Canal.



Greater New Haven covers just 369 square miles, but our cuisine will take you around the world. New Haven's history of welcoming immigrants translates into a culinary feast that covers five continents. Try Lalibela's Ethiopian menu or the best of Thailand at Mai Tai Restaurant. Sample Afro-Cuban cuisine at Soul de Cuba or Latin American fusion at Pacifico. The Union League Café is a French favorite, and Lúdâl Italian Restaurant is an elegant Italian trattoria. Jalapeño Heaven specializes in Mexican dishes, while The Wharf serves up New American cuisine. This list is just an appetizer of the culinary choices waiting for you throughout the region.

Don't forget to order drinks! Established wineries include **Chamard, Gouveia**, **Paradise Hills**, **Savino**, **Rose**, and **Rosabianca**. Beer flows throughout the region as well. Among the most popular breweries are **Stony Creek Brewery** in Branford, with seating overlooking the Branford River, and New Haven's own **East Rock Brewing Company**.

New Haven is best known, of course, as the home of pizza. Rivals

Sally's Apizza and Frank Pepe Pizzeria Napoletana go up against other hometown favorites like Modern Apizza, BAR, Zuppardi's Apizza, and Zeneli Pizzeria & Cucina Napoletana. Visit a few and judge for yourself which one serves up the best slice.

Connecticut's rich farmland means many of our restaurants have embraced local produce. Menus vary with the seasons as our imaginative chefs integrate fresh ingredients into both new and traditional recipes. You can buy fresh yourself at pop-up farmers' markets and shops like **Bishop's Orchards Farm Market** in Guilford and **Hindinger Farm** in Hamden.

A full day of sightseeing should include a break for refreshments, too. Check out the many coffee shops, ice cream parlors, and small cafes along the way, including the top-rated **Arethusa Farm Dairy** in New Haven, **Ashley's Ice Cream** in New Haven and Guilford, and **Willoughby's Coffee & Tea** in New Haven, Branford, and Madison, among others.

IMPORTANT CONNECTICUT LAWS FOR VISITORS

Cell Phone Usage in Motor Vehicles
Connecticut law requires drivers 18 years
of age and older to use hands-free accessories to legally use a cell phone or mobile
electronic device while operating a motor
vehicle. Under the law, drivers 16 or 17
years of age are prohibited from using any
mobile telephone, including phones with
hands-free accessories, while driving.
Also, no person shall use a hand-held
mobile telephone or other electronic device
or type, read or send text or a text message
with or from a mobile telephone or mobile
electronic device while operating a motor
vehicle.

Liquor Laws The legal drinking age in Connecticut is twenty-one.

Seat Belts and Child Restraint Systems

Connecticut law states (1) Infants must remain rear-facing until they are a minimum of both 2 year and 30 pounds; (2) Toddlers must be in a forward facing car seat with 5 point harness until 5 years and 40 pounds; (3) Children should ride in a booster until they reach 8 years old AND 60 pounds (they must meet both requirements); and (4) children, tweens and teens must be in a seat belt whenever they ride in a vehicle.

Further Recommended: Children should ride in the back seat until they are 13 years old. All people and objects should be properly restrained whenever they are in a vehicle. Children who ride in a booster seat must use a lap and shoulder belt.

Some of the benefits of living in Connecticut have been in the spotlight since March 2020. Less dense towns with beautiful parks and beaches provided safe recreation areas for residents of all ages. In addition, Connecticut's public school system is one of the best in the nation making it an ideal setting for young families. With New Haven as the region's core city, there is no shortage of cultural institutions, restaurants, and shopping.

The types of housing in Greater New Haven runs the gamut from 19th century claassics to state-of-the-art sustainable homes. Homeowners in New Haven County have seen their home values increase by 20% in Q2 2021 over Q2 2020.* Developers recognize the appeal of the region and are continuing to invest in new development projects. As of summer 2021, there are approximately 800 apartments under construction and more than 3,000

Yale New Haven Health

New Haven is generally recognized as the economic engine of Connecticut, particularly in bioscience. In June 2021, Downtown Crossing kicked off Phase 3 of a multi-year transformational project. Phase 3 includes the construction of 101 College Street with 500,000 sq. feet of new bioscience space. 100 College Street was completed in 2015 and is fully occupied. This comprehensive project includes the transformation of an expressway into pedestrian and bicycle-friendly boulevards designed with the active participation of the community. Ultimately, Downtown Crossing will create acres of developable land and a vibrant center of life in the medical district.

Research institutions in the region received over \$660 billion in National Institute of Health (NIH) funding in fiscal year 2020, placing New Haven in a class with Seattle, Boston, Baltimore, Durham, Philadelphia, and other cities with advanced research centers. With the Yale School of Medicine driving growth, Greater New Haven is now the 2nd largest biotech cluster in New

England.

Pandemic recovery is well underway in Greater New Haven. As many of our businesses were deemed essential, they remained open throughout the pandemic. In addition, our healthcare and higher education sectors joined forces to implement extensive testing and to stand up vaccination centers creating an environment for sector reopening throughout our economy. Connecticut was the first state to have 70% of its eligible population vaccinated in May 2021. These efforts have boosted consumer confidence and allowed residents to return to many of their former activities. Hospitality and leisure continue to lag in recovery and is not expected to fully recover until 2024. Nonetheless, we have two new hotels opening this year and one slated for mid-2023. Given the 18 hotels in the pipeline at the beginning of the pandemic, we anticipate more of those projects to be restarted as demand increases.

ECONOMIC RECOVERY

Greater New Haven is fortunate to have five solid sectors supporting our economy: healthcare; higher education; bioscience; manufacturing; and arts, culture, and tourism. The region, as around the globe, endured high unemployment during the early days of the pandemic. However, our economy fared better than most. From the beginning, numerous businesses were designated as essential and many of the jobs in our region can be performed remotely allowing many workers to continue to work.

Healthcare

The healthcare sector continues to thrive in Greater New Haven. Yale New Haven Health (YNHH) is a full-fledged healthcare delivery network that includes Yale New Haven Hospital, Bridgeport Hospital (Bridgeport and Milford Campuses), Greenwich Hospital, Lawrence + Memorial Hospital, Westerly Hospital, and Northeast Medical Group. With more than 28,500 employees and 6,911 medical staff, Yale New Haven Health had over 119,000 inpatient discharges and 3.7 million outpatient encounters in Fiscal Year 2020. YNHH is the primary teaching hospital for Yale School of Medicine.

As one of the first states hit with the coronavirus in March 2020, there were virtually no treatment protocols for the virus and very limited testing. To meet the unexpected demand for medical services, YNHH fundamentally altered their operations to care


for an overwhelming number of COVID-19 patients. YNHH provided excellent care for COVID patients and worked diligently to educate the public on safety measures.

In fall 2020, the second wave was upon us. While still without a vaccine, YNHH significantly lowered the number of COVID hospital admissions, COVID patients in the ICU, and patients on ventilators. As vaccines became available, the health system stood up multiple vaccine centers, including one at Yale West Campus, and by April 2021 had delivered over 300,000 vaccines.

The region has two additional inpatient hospitals: VA Connecticut Healthcare System and MidState Medical Center.

Biomedical and Life Sciences



100 College Street

Bioscience is growing in Greater New Haven. Anchored by scientific research at Yale, the region's bioscience cluster includes both large pharmaceutical companies and small startups, developing new drugs, therapies and medical devices. With a statewide priority focus on bioscience, the South Central Connecticut region is ground zero for bioscience infrastructure of skilled scientists, technicians.

In the past year, there have been blockbuster deals between Pfizer and Arvinas on a breast cancer drug, as well as the \$39 billion acquisition

of Alexion by AstraZeneca. Alexion is a global biopharmaceutical company focused on developing life-changing therapies for people living with rare disorders. Alexion was the primary tenant of 100 College Street, the first of two bioscience towers in the Downtown Crossing project. The construction of the second tower, 101 College Street, is underway with lease agreements in place with both Arvinas and Yale University. The new space will allow startup bioscience companies expand into graduation space vacated by other companies.

Cornovus Pharmaceuticals is a developer of a heart attack drug used to treat cardiac hypertrophy and heart failure.

Cybrexa Therapeutics alphalex is a tumor targeting platform that powers new applications and combinations of existing cancer therapeutics.

L2 Diagnostics is a biotechnology company with focus on new small molecule therapeutics, vaccines, and diagnostics for immunological and infectious diseases.

Oui Therapeutics, LLC and its affiliate Vita Health, are leaders in developing and providing digitally driven solutions for complex and challenging health problems, including suicide prevention.


ReNetX Bio is developing first-in-class therapeutics for people living with currently incurable neurological disorders.

Thetis Pharmaceuticals is developing a pipeline of therapies for solid tumor cancers and autoimmune diseases.

Virscio develops and provides advanced preclinical models, methods and technologies to improve therapeutic innovation and R&D efficiency.

New Haven is home to Yale University, one of the most respected universities in the world. Yet Yale is only one of the seven colleges in Greater New Haven. Drawing approximately 50,000 students from around the globe, higher education creates a highly skilled workforce and provides a wide-range of jobs within the colleges themselves.

The colleges offer an extensive range of concentrations including forensic science at the University of New Haven's Henry C. Lee Institute, BioPath at Southern Connecticut State University, and the expanding offerings at Quinnipiac University, including the Frank H. Netter MD School of Medicine and the School of Nursing. The colleges' curricula support our most vibrant industries.

With over 30,000 employees, Greater New Haven's colleges and universities also offer a wide range of career opportunities. Yale University provides exceptional research opportunities. However, a quick peek at any of the major job posting sites demonstrates the diversity of available career paths. The positions can be highly technical, administrative, or scholarly as these institutions operate as mini-cities.

The impact of higher education on the region's economic vitality goes far beyond educating students and direct hires. Each year, approximately 50,000 students attend college in the region creating substantial demand for the goods and services provided by local businesses.

Today's manufacturing is lean, green, and clean employing advanced technology including IoT, I4.0, AR, Mechatronics, and Machine Learning. Manufacturing in our region is diverse and spans firms that make precision instruments for medical and aerospace industries, security devices for information systems, specialty chemicals, fixtures in metals, plastics, and other materials using a range of technologies and processes from additive manufacturing, 3D printing to traditional stamping and machine tooling, and more. Some have been operating

as family businesses for over five generations; others are larger, multinational corporations.

We have a highly skilled and productive workforce focusing on lean and innovative manufacturing. Workforce Alliance and our local colleges are educating the next generation of manufacturers through stackable certificate programs. These programs have been developed in collaboration with the private sector to ensure the students have the skills they need to enter the workforce.

Some of our larger manufacturing employers include BYK, Edgewell, Honeywell, Sargent/ Assa Abloy, Ulbrich Steel, among many others.

In 2019, Greater New Haven had 18 hotels in the development pipeline with a booming tourism industry. Workforce Alliance had launched a Hospitality Career Initiative, an immersive hospitality 5-week training done in collaboration with colleges and hospitality industry partners to meet expanding demand.

Clearly, the pandemic dramatically changed the immediate outlook for the lodging industry. Currently, there are two new hotels nearing completion, the Hotel Marcel and the Cambria New Haven, with a third hotel scheduled to open in 2023 in North Haven. The American Hotel & Lodging Association does not anticipate a full recovery in the U.S. until 2024. Being the home of Yale New Haven Health, Yale University, and six other colleges, we hope to rebound sooner as meetings and events return.

Arts, culture and tourism are major contributors to both the regional economy and the overall quality of life. The arts and entertainment industries were devastated by the pandemic but through robust networking among advocacy organizations and peer groups, the industry maximized the state and federal funding opportunities. As events and venues continue to reopen, public safety is a top priority.

To support the hospitality industry, REX Development maintains visitNewHaven.com, produces an annual visitors and relocation guide, distributes weekly newsletters, hosts familiarization tours for travel writers and tour operators, and attends a variety of tradeshows to reach both national and international audiences. During the pandemic we attended virtual tradeshows in preparation for the resumption of group travel.

According to the Connecticut State Office of Tourism's pre-COVID statewide Tourism Tracker, the industry generated:

- \$14.7 billion in business sales supported by traveler spending
- \$1.7 billion in taxes generated by visitor activity
- 82,688 jobs directly related to tourism

As of September 2021, over 75% of eligible Connecticut residents had received their first COVID vaccine. Building on this success is a priority for community well-being and the recovery of the hospitality and leisure industries.

While we have a strong technology sector, many professional technology jobs can be found within the healthcare, biomedical and life sciences, higher education, and manufacturing sectors. With a highly educated workforce and initiatives to develop talent through certificate programs, we are investing for continued, inclusive growth in this sector. In support of these efforts, the State of Connecticut is rolling out tech specific programs such the Innovation Corridor, Greentech, and Broadband for All.

Fueled by local creativity and Yale's research talent, New Haven is a hot bed for entrepreneurship.

Home to the second densest concentration of federal R&D funding in the country, Yale University's Office of Cooperative research supports a rapidly growing biotechnology startup ecosystem. Companies like Alexion, Achillion, BioHaven, and Arvinas are changing downtown's skyline, with several new bioscience towers and three laboratory incubators in development. Four recent IPO's, multiple acquisitions, and over a billion dollars in venture investment and distribution deals have made New Haven the third fastest growing city for venture capital investment in the country.

Software companies are growing across the city, hiring new coding talent from five local universities and a new Holberton-model software engineering school. Building on New Haven's healthcare strengths, companies like PatientWisdom, InboxHealth, and WellLinks are part of a hub of digital health services near Yale New Haven Hospital. Nearby, civic technologies reach across the globe to coordinate emergency responses (Veoci), municipal citizen service interactions (SeeClickFix), and college

admissions (Technolutions). And at the new District technology campus, AR/VR coders help surgeons remotely coach life-saving procedures at remote clinics (SphereGen). With five coworking spaces across the city and a global network of software teams to partner with (MindTrust), both software talent and founders have places to grow in New Haven.

Artists, hobbyists, and inventors can find a home at MakeHaven, downtown's membership-based makerspace. Prototypes developed at MakeHaven have won federal design competitions over a dozen patents.

Aspiring entrepreneurs can find support for their project from CTNext, Connecticut Innovations, the Tsai Center for Innovative Thinking at Yale, the YNNH's Center for Health Care Innovation, several New Haven-based venture capital firms, and over ten different entrepreneur support programs for early and growth-stage businesses.

If you are ready to put your idea into action, Greater New Haven is the place to be.



Workforce

The Health Careers Advancement Program

(HCAP) provides tuition assistance, professional development, and job placement to eligible job seekers. Individuals who have prior healthcare industry certifications can get help to return to school, add more skills and move up the career ladder!

Hospitality Career Initiative is a partnership between the University of New Haven and the New Haven-based nonprofit Workforce Alliance provided an immersion into the hospitality industry and job placement assistance.


